



NestFest 2026: Join the Movement to Protect Texas' Nesting Birds and Sea Turtles

Upper Texas Coast — On March 10, 2026, communities across the coast will come together for NestFest 2026, a large-scale coastal cleanup dedicated to protecting nesting habitats for shorebirds and sea turtles. In partnership with SPLASH (Stopping Plastics and Litter Along Shorelines), American Bird Conservancy, Gulf Coast Bird Observatory, Gulf Center for Sea Turtle Research, and Texas Master Naturalists, NestFest unites volunteers, nature lovers, and conservation groups for a day of action that makes a lasting difference for Texas wildlife.

Every spring, Texas beaches welcome nesting birds like Wilson's Plovers and Least Terns, as well as Kemp's Ridley sea turtles, the most endangered sea turtle in the world. Unfortunately, our coastlines collect trash up to ten times faster than other Gulf states—threatening these fragile nesting areas. By joining NestFest, you'll help remove marine debris before nesting season begins and ensure these species have a safe place to raise their young.

Locations: Cleanup sites across Galveston Island, Follet's Island, and Bolivar Peninsula

What to Bring: Comfortable clothing, sunscreen, a hat, reusable water bottle, and your enthusiasm! Cleanup supplies like gloves and bags will be provided.
