







# **Protecting Vulnerable Species**

The Gulf Coast provides vital nesting habitat for a variety of shorebirds and sea turtles, many of which are listed as vulnerable, threatened, or endangered. Species like the Snowy Plover, Least Tern, and the critically endangered Kemp's Ridley sea turtle depend on these coastal areas to lay their eggs and raise their young.

Unfortunately, trash poses a serious threat to these species. Litter can entangle birds, turtles, and hatchlings, or be mistaken for food—causing injury, illness, or even death. Sea turtles face these dangers not only on our beaches but throughout their lives in the ocean, where floating trash continues to pose a threat.

By supporting NestFest, you're helping remove harmful debris and restore safe nesting habitats for shorebirds and sea turtles. Together, we can give these incredible animals a better chance to survive and thrive along our coast.




# **Founding Partners**

NestFest was founded in 2023 by five partner organizations: SPLASh (Stopping Plastics and Litter Along Shorelines), Gulf Center For Sea Turtle Research, American Bird Conservancy, Texas Master Naturalists, and Gulf Coast Bird Observatory. All five of these organizations have years of experience in conserving wildlife, planning events, improving habitat, and bringing the community together for service projects.

### **Methods**

Each cleanup location is carefully selected by our biologists based on its use as beach-nesting habitat for sea turtles and shorebirds. Hundreds of volunteers attend this event and remove thousands of pounds of trash while maintaining the integrity of each site.

NestFest has had an amazing impact on coastal Texas wildlife, habitat and communities! This event mitigates the negative impacts of trash pollution on sensitive species included decreasing the chances of wildlife entanglement and plastic ingestion.
